Queensland's Great Barrier Reef is the largest coral reef system in the world and extends around 1,500 miles from the northern tip of the State. There are numerous ways to experience the reef, here's a sample of some of the best.

Breakfast on the Reef - This very special tour features a morning flight over the Great Barrier Reef to a private, and pristine, coral cay which is yours for two full hours. Seaplane over Heart Reef - Share the natural wonder that is Heart Reef with a loved one on a very special seaplane scenic flight. Heart Reef is a unique composition of coral which has naturally formed into the shape of a heart, and it can only be properly appreciated from the air. Sprint to the reef - A new snorkelling adventure tour has its guests on the reef just 15 minutes after they leave Port Douglas. Getting there is half the fun aboard the 500 horse power enviro speed boat reaching speeds of more than 40 knots. Diving delights - Mike Ball has been a pioneer in the Australian dive industry since he started his dive school in Townsville in 1969. Visitors with Mike Ball Dive Expeditions can still expect to find an extra special experience on tours including in-water encounters with friendly Minke whales in waters between Cooktown and Lizard Island and dives at the famous Cod Hole off Lizard Island with the giant potato cod and huge Queensland groupers. Sleep with the fish - Reefsleeper is a once in a lifetime opportunity to experience the solitude of spending the night right on the reef. Located at the Reefworld pontoon at Hardy Reef, 40 nautical miles from the mainland, the experience includes overnight accommodation (maximum six people), alfresco dinner including wine, full breakfast, buffet lunches, sunset cocktails, two scuba dives or guided snorkelling safari, and use of facilities including the underwater viewing chamber, semi-submersible and waterslide. Day trip to Lady Elliot - View one of the most pristine parts of the Great Barrier Reef from above and below on a day trip to Lady Elliot island from Brisbane or the Gold and Sunshine Coasts. Join a guided tour on a glass bottom boat, snorkel amongst the most amazing coral formations and marine creatures, hand feed fish in the lagoon or take a guided reef walk. Green Island - Lying just 27km off Cairns, Green Island is the only coral cay on the Great Barrier Reef with a rainforest – making it a one stop tropical experience. Take a 45 minute journey across the Coral Sea to the 15 hectare island which is home to 126 native plant species, colourful birdlife and magnificent coral gardens. Explore the rainforest and other wonders of the islands on a self-guided eco walk, then cool off with a swim, dive or snorkel amongst the tropical fish and coral gardens. www.greatadventures.com.au

Seaplane to Orpheus – The view from the seaplane ride to reef-fringed Orpheus Island is a scenic delight and the water landing a great way to arrive at the 1,368 hectare island which has been a National Park since 1960. The island is also home to the James Cook Research Centre and a guided tour provides a great introduction to the quality of marine life found in the surrounding waters. The island has just one luxury resort with individual villas overlooking the Coral Sea, and is accessible only by seaplane from Townsville. www.orpheus.com.au
