Queensland's world-class amusement and theme parks are continually introducing new shows and attractions to excite and challenge their guests. Read on to see what's on offer in 2010....

Australian Outback Spectacular, Gold Coast

Guests now have an extra chance to experience The Australian Outback Spectacular at a new lunchtime matinee on Sundays at 12.30pm. 'Heroes of the Light Horse' is the new show for the Spectacular and celebrates the link between the stockmen and the legendary Australian Light Horse. The 90 minute show also runs nightly Tuesday to Sunday and entry includes a three course dinner, drinks and a stockman's hat. www.myfun.com.au

Sea World, Gold Coast

A multi-million dollar children's adventure precinct, the Adventure Zone will include a huge range of activities to delight the young and young at heart. The theme park's roller coaster, the Corkscrew, was also given a makeover and relaunched for Christmas 2009 as the Sea Viper, featuring new low profile carriages allowing riders to experience thrills on the triple loop-the-loop track like never before. www.myfun.com.au

The new thrill sensation begins as the rider plummets through a trap door at their feet, accelerating into a massive vertical free fall drop and then up into a looping slide! Dreamworld, Gold Coast

Virtual V8 racing and new generation laser combat AVPX are the latest attractions catching the attention of visitors at Dreamworld. Visitors booking in for the V8 Supercars Redline experience literally put themselves in the driver's seat and test their skills against Australia's best in simulated racing cars. They even strap themselves in for the ride on the famous Mt Panorama race track. AVPX is an immersive combat experience where humans are the bait and their mission is to survive. White Water World, Gold Coast

White Water World has launched the "The Wedgie", a looping 85 metre long waterslide where riders take the challenge alone with no mats or tubes. It takes only seven seconds to complete and has been given a 4+ in the thrill rating when four is the max. The rider starts with a near vertical descent and then barrels through a human-sized half coil before entry into the splash pool. www.whitewaterworld.com.au



Adventure Parc, Gold Coast

Located at North Tamborine in the Gold Coast hinterland on 3.6 hectares of rainforest, the challenging ropes course is designed for family fun and fitness. 2010 will see the addition of another green course, offering two different starting points and a flying fox down to reception. The course is open to all willing adults and children 1.6 metre tall from their heels to the tip of outstretched hands and qualified supervisors guide participants through the activities. www.adventureparcaustralia.com

Green Challenge, Gold Coast

Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary's treetops ropes course, the Green Challenge, has expanded to now offer 65 challenges over four separate courses through the eucalypt and rainforest canopy above the native wildlife at the sanctuary. Dracula's Haunted House, Gold Coast
